1872 Neosho Colored School Rehabilitation Project

The Carver Birthplace Association (Diamond, MO), together with the Harry S Truman Coordinating Council, invites qualified historic architects to submit Statements of Qualifications (SOQ) for the 1872 Neosho School Rehabilitation Project. This project aims to preserve the building's historic integrity while incorporating modern amenities, guided by the 2012 Historic Structure Report (HSR).

This project is made possible through multiple grants that support this historic preservation effort, including the African American Civil Rights Grant Program, National Park Service, USDI (Grant No: P24AP00770); the State Historic Preservation Office, MO-DNR(Pre-Construction Grant No: P24AF01099-013), the African American Cultural Heritage Action Fund provided by the National Trust for Historic Preservation, a grant award from the Arvest Foundation, as well as donations from the general public.
